Take home two free picture books! Pizza will be provided. This event is free, but registration is required. Call Adrienne at 205-203-4655 to register.

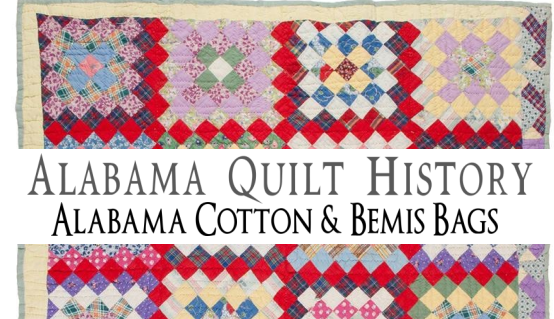
